

February 11 Meeting on Madhubani Painting

Our February 11 branch meeting features Deepti Agrawal: *The Ancient Art of Madhubani Painting*. The women in a small region in Northeast India have been using Madhubani painting to tell the stories of their

lives. Depicting mythological and social scenes, every painting reflects the belief systems, cultural practices, and social arrangements of a specific era in history. After centuries of being limited to its region of origin, the art form is now being discovered by the urban populace worldwide and is fast emerging as a commercial art form.

Having practiced this style of art since childhood, artist Deepti Agrawal explores the changing forms, trends, and mediums of Madhubani painting over time, while also exploring the hidden tales behind some of its most popular artworks from the early 1900s. Agrawal provides a demo and a work-along session where participants practice the Madhubani style and learn more about its rich heritage. Come prepared to try your hand at the art form and have some fun!

Notes From the Board Meeting

In December the Branch Board met twice—one regularly scheduled meeting on December 15, and the other a special meeting on December 7 to reconsider the scholarships to be awarded in 2023.

December 15 Board Meeting

Sita Bhaskaran has agreed to take on the responsibility of branch secretary.

There was discussion of what kind of scholarship awards event to hold in 2023. The event in June 2022 was well attended, with an excellent keynote speaker, but was also expensive to host. Jodi will call an ad hoc committee to consider costs and benefits and to plan the 2023 event.

Our Public Policy Team is getting ready for Lobby Day / Week at the end of January. The WA State Public Policy Team has the work of reviewing and vetting proposed state bills to support due to staffing issues at national AAUW.

We will work on recruiting an Edmonds College staff member as our college liaison.

December 7 Special Board Meeting

In opening the special Board meeting, Jodi clarified how our branch goals relate to our scholarships for the 2022-2023 program year:

- To increase our membership and our visibility
- To reach out to diverse communities, including BIPoC, first-

generation students, and students entering fields where women are under-represented

With these goals in mind, we looked at how we can honor both the work of the Scholarship Team and the work of the Art Show Planning Team.


These changes were proposed and approved by the Board:

- Addition of a second college scholarship, to be awarded to a continuing WSU Everett student, in any field of study, with special attention to a first-generation student
- Expansion of eligibility for the three high school scholarships to include the Everett and Marysville School Districts

In 2023, five scholarships will be awarded to female students:

- One scholarship to an Edmonds College student continuing her study in a STEM field
- One scholarship to a continuing WSU Everett student, in any field, with preference given to a first-generation student
- Three scholarships to high school students planning STEM fields of study, graduating from schools in the Edmonds, Everett, or Marysville School Districts

Public Policy Updates and Actions

I hope you will join us at our January 14 Branch meeting to talk about women's rights and gender equity, and the issues most important to you as an AAUW member.

Lobby Day 2023 Theme: Legislation and Gender Equity

Sign up for our Virtual Lobby Day on January 30. <u>Check out the program on the state website.</u> This is a super important year for women's rights and gender equity and Your Voice Matters. There is an alarming trend in Washington state to not report or even not collect gender data. Gender can be missing from the list or required demographics in bills. Even bills with a well-known gender problem may miss including gender. The Diversity in Clinical Trials bill (<u>SB</u> 5723) last session is an example of a bill that we tagged as "gender negative" as it was missing an important gender component.

This year we will be reviewing bills and tagging them as gender silent, gender neutral, gender positive and gender negative. Let's talk more

about that on January 14!

What can you do to get ready for AAUW-WA Lobby Day / Week?

Confirm your legislative district (<u>Find my District</u>). Check out our member roster where we added Legislative Districts. Let us know if we need to change yours!

Get to know your legislators and what committees they chair or sit on. Legislators only have the bandwidth to carefully review bills related to their committees or bills their constituents (YOU!) ask them to review and weigh in on. Your voice matters.

Sign up for our AAUW-WA Lobbyist Nancy Sapiro's weekly Legislative Update. This is the best way to keep up-to-date on AAUW-WA policy work during the session. The LU will include action alerts. Your voice matters. Last session AAUW-ESK members made a big difference helping pass bills by signing in PRO. Committee chairs called out the number of people who sign in PRO or CON. It matters! Sign up by clicking here. The first LU will be sent Friday, January 13.

Sign up to visit your legislator during Lobby Day / Week. We will schedule virtual visits after the session starts to be held the week of January 30. Expect an email from your district leader.
