Scholarships: The speaker at the recognition event on June 10 for our scholarship winners will be Cathy Draper's former student. She is currently working at SpaceX, and is excited about being our speaker! Cathy reported that the speaker is bright and articulate.

Public Policy Updates and Actions

See our state website for <u>public policy legislative updates</u> from our state AAUW Lobbyist Nancy Sapiro. The budgets have been released and thanks to our new state capital gains tax, we should see some additional support for education, childcare, and housing included.

2023 ELECTIONS. May 15 is the official start of the 5-day filing period, but I am already seeing signs for candidates in my neighborhood! This is a big year for LOCAL elections.

- Snohomish County positions: Snohomish County Executive, two Council positions, Assessor, Auditor Clerk, Sheriff, and Treasurer.
- King County: 3 Council positions, Assessor, and Director of Elections.
- Three cities have Mayor positions: Edmonds, Lake Forest Park, and

Marysville.

- All our cities have at least 2 City Council positions up for election. Edmonds has 6!
- All School Districts have at least 2 Director positions up for election.

AAUW has some good candidate comparison tools we can use to review candidates, and the League of Women Voters is already starting their planning for candidate forums. Shirley Buono was our liaison last year for candidate forums for local candidates and I also joined in a bit. It was fun, frustrating, and informative.

Let's start brainstorming about how our Branch wants to participate this year. The state public policy team will brainstorm in May (after the legislative session is over) on how we can support branches in local Get-Out-the-Vote and nonpartisan Candidate Comparison strategies. If you know anyone considering running for office, now is the time to give them a nudge! They have until May 19 to file. There are a lot of good resources available for those interested in running for office. And AAUW has a new one!

The state Public Policy team is reviewing a California Program, <u>GovTrek</u>, as a possible program to launch in Washington in the future. It is a "virtual program for high school junior and senior girls designed to elevate the next generation to pursue careers in public service and elected office."

At our April Branch meeting we can talk more about your ideas for public policy for our Branch. You can also pop-in to the state public policy meetings held at noon on Tuesdays. See our calendar for the Zoom link.
