

# **Public Policy Updates and Actions**

I am super excited to share that Susan Teel has agreed to co-chair Public Policy this year! I hope many of you will consider officially joining our Public Policy team.

Sine Die! The 2023 regular legislative session is over. Seven of our Lobby Day bills passed. Our Lobbyist Nancy Sapiro's <u>Legislative</u> <u>Update</u> has a full review. The two bills that didn't pass - *Keep Our Care Act* (hospital mergers) and a *Working Families Tax Credit* bill - will be back next session.

Our allies in the reproductive rights space are enthusiastic that 5 abortion protection bills are passing as well as a robust budget that includes much needed resources to support reproductive care in Washington State, including workforce expansion and facility security.

We are also happy to have a \$50 million budget for domestic violence

### May is Older Americans Month

Past Issues

AAUW added age and income in our diversity characteristics. This allows Washington State to take a deep dive into age equity and income equity.

Ageism (both toward younger and older people) has increased in the US and worldwide. The <u>2020 National Poll on Healthy Aging</u> found 82% of older Americans reported experiencing ageism regularly.

Ageism is defined as stereotyping, prejudice, and discrimination and it has benevolent and hostile forms; both are harmful. The World Health Organization (WHO) launched the <u>Global Campaign to Combat</u> <u>Ageism</u> with a campaign goal to change the way we think, feel, and act towards age and ageing. WHO recommends 3 ways to initiate change - all of which AAUW can incorporate into our programs:

- Policies and laws can reduce ageism towards any age group.
- Educational interventions can reduce ageism from primary school to university, and in formal and non-formal educational contexts.
- Intergenerational interventions can foster positive interaction between people of different generations and reduce intergenerational tensions.

May, *Older Americans Month*, is a good time to start brainstorming about how our Branch can help combat ageism in our community! One of the best books on ageism is "*Breaking the Age Code: How Your Beliefs About Aging Determine How Long & Well You Live*" by Yale Professor Becca Levy. You can watch an <u>interview</u> with Becca on <u>YouTube</u>.

### **Elections are coming!**

The filing period for the 2023 elections is May 15 - 19. As we think about ageism, please note that as an adult, you are never too young or too old to run for election, especially school board positions! In Washington State our minimum age for all elected positions is 18 years old, with no age cut off.
