to us an.







AAUW ESK Branch Scholarships

Current Plan for Scholarships Awarded by the ESK Branch and Funded by the AE3 Foundation

For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the Edmonds SnoKing Branch of AAUW plans to award five college scholarships, each in the amount of \$2,000. The Foundation decided upon the total amount to be awarded this year, and the Board, in conjunction with the Scholarship Committee, decided how to award it. Our Scholarship Committee has two sub-committees, one for high school student scholarships, and one for the college student scholarships.

There will be three scholarships awarded to students graduating from a high school in 2024 enrolled in the Edmonds, Everett, or Marysville school districts. A description of the process for awarding these scholarships will be provided by Cathy Draper in a later newsletter.

One scholarship will be awarded to a current student at WSU Everett.

student scholarship sub-committee. The sub-committee members (currently Helen Behan, Aline Wilson, and Lori Cross) will select a student who is judged likely to succeed in her stated academic and career goals, and has had to overcome adversity in her academic journey.

The criteria for this scholarship are:

- Identifies as female.
- Is a first-generation college student.
- Is a resident of Washington State (not an international student). Does not need to be a citizen.
- Has a financial need to attend WSU.
- Has a GPA of at least 3.0.
- Intends to complete a Bachelor's degree.

Another scholarship will be awarded through the Edmonds College Foundation to a continuing student at Edmonds College. All scholarships and financial aid at Edmonds College are awarded through their Foundation. The Foundation will forward applications of the top students meeting the criteria to our college student scholarship sub-committee. The sub-committee members will select a student who is judged likely to be successful in her stated academic and career goals, and has overcome adversity in her academic journey.

The criteria for this scholarship are:

- Identifies as female.
- Is a resident of Washington state (not an international student). Does not need to be a citizen.
- Has a financial need to attend Edmonds College.

- Has maintained a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- . Intends to obtain a Bachelor's degree from a four-year institution.
- Intends to major in a STEM field.
