### Roles Needed

Please know that all roles will be provided guidance and assistance. Those of us with experience are here to help. It's important all members feel confident in our volunteer roles.

<u>Artist acquisition (Responsibility of entire Branch)</u>: This role seeks out potential artists and encourages them to apply for a spot at our event. Timeline: Now – September.

<u>Sponsorship acquisition (6-8 volunteers needed)</u>: This role seeks out small and large businesses that could potentially pledge a significant amount of money.
