Notes From the Board Meeting

The open membership initiative did not pass. It was close. Changes to AAUW's bylaws require 2/3 majority (66.6%) to pass. AAUW members voted 65.1% to approve the measure, just shy of passing.

The High School scholarship team selected three students to receive our scholarships, one from each of the 3 school districts we support: Edmonds, Everett, and Marysville. The College scholarship team selected a student for the WSU scholarship, and is working with Edmonds College to pick a student for the Edmonds College scholarship. Preparations for the Scholarship Award ceremony on June 8 are on-going. There is discussion about having an undergraduate scholarship in the future - for students who want to pursue the fine arts. This will be discussed further.

The costume jewelry fundraiser raised ~\$508 for our Branch expenses. The Art Show will be on October 4.

The Board discussed having a "Meet and Greet" September Branch meeting. This would involve encouraging members to bring friends who might be potential members. Also, because of the success of last year's "Meet the Candidates" event, the Board discussed doing another similar event this Fall. Finally, Jodi has been appointed the liaison between AAUW and the Washington State Women's Commission.


