would like to have more input on branch activities and be more active in our branch this position may be for you! Email or call Jodi to discuss in more detail.



Public Policy Updates and Action

It is Fall and it is campaign sign season!

<u>AAUW</u> and <u>AAUW-WA</u> are endorsing a NO vote on the Initiatives on the WA ballot.

We have one congressional race considered a battleground round race, congressional district 3 (southwest WA). AAUW has published a <u>Head-to-Head comparison</u> for that race.

Candidate forums and debates are ongoing, and most are recorded. Check out League of Women Voters WA for <u>statewide races</u> and Snohomish County for <u>local candidate forums</u>.

September 15 – October 15 is Hispanic Heritage Month. October 3rd is Latina Equal Pay Day. Latinas working full-time, year-round are paid 57 cents and all earners (including part-time and seasonal) are paid 52 cents for every dollar paid to non-Hispanic white men. AAUW has a number of reports on Latinas and equal pay. See our one-pager list of reports.

A new report on <u>Economic Security for Older Women</u> was recently released by the Biden-Harris Administration. AAUW-WA will be discussing how we can include the <u>policy recommendations</u> in our

advocacy work for 2025.

Hope to see you on Saturday, October 19th for the in-person <u>AAUW-WA State-wide Meeting</u> at Renton Technical College, 9AM to 4PM. Theme is "Telling Our Stories," with keynote speaker April Sims, President of the Washington State Labor Council.
