Paul was one of the foremost leaders and strategists of the campaign for the Nineteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which prohibits sex discrimination in the right to vote. Paul initiated, and along with Lucy Burns and others, strategic events such as the Woman Suffrage Procession and the Silent Sentinels, which were part of the successful
