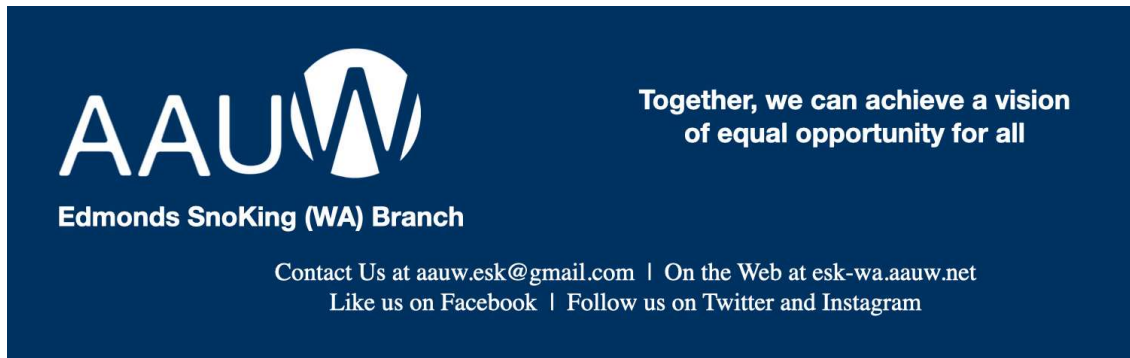


Hello AAUW members.

These donations are now providing nonperishable food to newly housed single women and mothers with children in the YWCA apartments in Lynnwood. ## **Notes From the Board Meeting**

Art Show update: WSU has pledged \$2,000 towards our scholarship fund. Elena said the Branch had received about \$4,000 worth of donated items for the Art Show. There will be 16 artists and 20 tables of art.

We will offer the same slate of scholarships as last year. There will be a total of six scholarships worth \$2,000 each. Of these, four scholarships will be for High School students planning to pursue studies in a college, with three of the scholarships being for students planning majors in a STEM field, and one for a student planning a degree in fine arts. We will offer one scholarship to an Edmonds College student studying in a STEM field, and one scholarship to a first-generation college student at WSU/Everett.

Two new interest groups are being formed: “Explore the Arts” and “Movie night”.

Jodi is investigating the national 5-Star Recognition Program. Last year our Branch earned a 3-star rating.
